Goal 1: DRA, Star Reading-on going data for the teachers

*Hiring teacher aids to work in the classroom, small group, one on one, free up teacher to work closely with individual students.

*AR during the school year for balanced literacy-AR points motivate students

*6 teachers to the 2 day CITES conference for training

*Before and after school double dosing program by aides and teachers-I wasn't a great success because it was hard to get teacher to stay and students to come.

*HAWK TIME-Enrich, Reteach 2-6, 2 teachers per grade reteach, and rest of the faculty enrich

*DRA was successful students passed, 2011 88% of students passed the CRT 82% of students didn't pass in 2012 we believe it is do to changes in the new core.

Writing Goal for 2012-92% of our 5th graders to pass which was a 2% improvement over the previous year. 100% of our students passed the DWA-Utah's Writing Assessment. The 100% included all Valley View's 5th graders.

Goal 2: Used Accelerated Math to regularly assess students for feedback. We had 77% of our students pass the CRT.

*Reviewed Minutes from November's meeting by Brittany Pulley

*Stubbs- School Improvement Plan:

*Next year we will be moving to the S.A.G.E test and nobody really knows what that looks like exactly. Our goal overall is to move and have our focus on students growth. Even if they aren't passing their benchmarks we would still like to see good growth.

*A member asked if we still wanted to keep our overall focus and language arts instead of math.

*Stubbs-We have to have language arts in our plan, but we can also include math.

*A member asked how we were going to cover the improvement plan.

*Stubbs-We come up with a couple of large goals and were backwards. Our school improvement plan is to decrease our low growth by 20% in math and language arts. Move them from low growth to high growth on the scatter plot.

*The scatter plot to show our growth is provided by the state.

*Action Steps:Hawk Time (intervention, curriculum extension), Staff Development, AR, STAR testing, increase of technology (SMARTBOARDS), ½ day sub for student collaboration.

*We didn't include math as part of our plan last year because it was the 1st year it was being implemented into the district. Last years end of your scores were 84% proficient in LA and 77% proficient in Math.

*Stubbs- This isn't something we are going to discuss in SCC. However, I would love to hear from parents and discuss the concerns and I will show them their teachers data.

School Improvement plan-

Adding on next years improvement plan

Mr. Stubbs voiced concern about the SAGE (new end of year test). We need our focus not to be on SGP(student growth percentage).

The district raised the tests level of the DRA- $\frac{1}{3}$ of Valley View students are not meeting benchmark.

Mrs. Stubbs would like our major focus to be on Language Arts and not math for next years school improvement plan.

Mastery Connect, and Star Tutoring Achievement for Reading.

Writing Program for Valley View-Providing school wide training. We would like to plan it close to a collaboration day.

Teachers would like the writing training at the beginning of the school year.

SAGE-End of year testing-Parents can practice at home, so students can get use to the style. Can't use the voice reading program at home because it is not on a secure browser. All our schools are on a secure browser.

Teacher asked how are we going to use the data from the tests to compare.

Stubbs-We are not going to use to compare next year. We still may be able to look at the SGP, but not proficiency.

Parents don't have a problem with not having math goals for next year, unless our students do not need math. I know it will be hard to measure math, but do we need math? We need programs for our high students. We need accelerated math or the next grade level math book for students to work through at a faster pace.

Stubbs- The problem with getting books from the higher graders it that the new core is not a spiral core. I need to stay within our core content, but enrich with more depth, not new material. They need to get their own core down, so we don't have holes.

Teachers:*Math tasks are great, but teachers have to create them and they take time.

Parents-Students follow along with the math lesson, but once they are finished they move to the next grades math book to teach themselves. Why are we putting a cap

on how far our students can go and what they are learning. Does accelerated math follow the new core?

Stubbs- Yes it does, but I haven't been impressed with the way we have used it at Valley View. A lot of teachers used it as a worksheet generator.

Teacher- It needs to be used in small group to help reteach and enrich, or preteach.

Parents- We need to train our teachers. Teachers may want it now that they don't have it. Master connect, data collection, teacher posts, grades tests and shows students mastery level. Follow key teachers who have the best instruction. It is past the point of options. Teachers must get on board moving forward it is not an option

Teacher- Sounds like pinterest for teachers.

Stubbs- Cost? \$5.50 a child min. 240, but we don't have the tools to continue AC. math. We need computers, testing scanners. We will survey our teachers feelings on accelerated math.

Parents- The PTA will help in anyway possible to provide for new programs.

Teachers- We need more labs technology, we need more labs.

Goal #3 Take students deeper into the core

Steps-K-6 will implement math tasks once a month. Teachers created/find appropriate math tasks to enrich/create higher order thinking. Teachers will submit math task and rubric to administration. Administration will observe grade levels once a month during task time.

\$1,920 and \$3,747 teacher substitutes for creating tasks and funding for document cameras.
