## **What is a Title 1 School?**

Title 1 is a federal education program that aides and helps higher poverty schools by providing additional Federal Funds to aide in meeting the needs of the students. Windsor Elementary is one of the Title 1 Schools in Alpine School District. The Title 1 funds received at Windsor Elementary go towards reducing the teacher/student ratio and helping to improve learning in literacy and math.

## **Professional Learning Communities:**

Every Monday teachers at Windsor Elementary meet together to discuss fundamental areas of student learning and ways to improve the learning and achievement of students. The Professional Learning Communities at Windsor Elementary focus on four essential questions:

- 1- What do we expect students to learn?
- 2- How will we know what students have learned?
- 3- How will we respond to students who aren't learning?
- 4- How will we respond to students who already know the material?

These four questions are the guide for us as we work to improve our instruction and student learning.

## **Fun Facts about Windsor:**

- Windsor is 54 years old.
- Over 600 students attend Windsor Elementary.
- 30% of Windsor students are English Language Learners.
- Miss Morgan retired this year from teaching at the age of 81
- One Teacher at Windsor can read and understand 7 different languages.
- A Windsor teacher has a black belt in Taekwondo.
- 19 teachers at Windsor are ESL endorsed.
- When Windsor was first built it consisted of the main hall and cafeteria.
- Windsor cost \$350,000 to build. It opened with 433 students.
- The North library wing was added in the mid 1970s.
- The West wing was added 6 years ago, and the gym was built 13 years ago.
- Keith Horton was Windsor's first principal.

Windsor Elementary is focused on student learning and continuous improvement. The chart below will show the student proficiency count, or those passing the end of level tests (CRT) in specific grades and curriculum for the 2009-2010 school year.
