Our transition teams are also developing new assessments for our post-high students to assist them in determining job skill development

2015-16 School Land Trust Goal:

With guidance and support, 80% of students K-12 will increase their math skills in their identified Essential Element Standard Area by at least 5% from their baseline by the end of April 2016.

Progress Update: Teachers met during the summer to develop math lesson plans, and identify essential math vocabulary. The math lessons correspond to the Essential Element Math goals that were selected for each grade level in May. At this time, students have had their baseline measured, and will be assessed every two weeks to measure their progress. Those identified as being below benchmark in January will receive targeted instruction during their goal time. A comprehensive report will be available in the spring.

2014-15 School Land Trust Final Report

Students in each grade level K-Post High School were assessed individually on their knowledge of Who, What, When, and Why questions in literacy text. This was done with familiar text. Elementary students K-6 went from a baseline average of 9% to a final average of 38%, a gain of 29% growth. Secondary students grades 7-12 went from a baseline of 38% to a post assessment average of 56%, which is an 18% gain. Post High school students ages 18-22 went from a baseline average of 20% to a post average of 33%, a 13% improvement. Overall, all grade levels made the 5% goal improvement with the exception of the Kindergarten students, which averaged a 3% gain from their baseline scores. Way to go Seagulls!
