Dear Parents,

Our theme for the month of January has been fairness. In helping our students to develop into responsible citizens, we have taught them what fairness means and why it is important.

I always approach this topic with a sense of trepidation. On the one hand, we want children to know that it is important to treat others fairly, but on the other hand, we also want our children to be able to deal with the fact life sometimes isn't fair. How do we teach fairness in an unfair world?

For me, it helps to remember two things: First, we always have choices. I wish all children had the attitude of: No matter what happens to me, I can choose to treat others right. Second, a sense of gratitude for what we have is key to living happily.

I want to share a pledge that some of the students at our school have taken. This was put together by Kay Beck, our Character Development Team Chairperson:

"I believe that every person has worth as an individual. I believe that every person is entitled to dignity and respect, regardless of race, color, intelligence, religion, and social status. I believe that every thought and every act of prejudice is harmful; if it is my thought or act, then it is harmful to me as well as to others. Therefore, from this day forward I will strive daily to eliminate prejudice from my thoughts and actions. I will discourage prejudice by others at every opportunity. I will treat all people with dignity and respect; and I will strive daily to honor this pledge, knowing that Cedar Ridge Elementary and the world will be a better place because of my effort."
