#### PTA Message

Welcome back! We hope things are going well for you and your children. Thanks to all the parents who have joined the PTA so far this year! We appreciate your support! Thanks to all who have signed up to help with the various programs we support during the year! It is not too late to join PTA or sign up to help with a program. Please watch for more info or contact me.

Joining PTA does not mean you have to donate your time. I understand if you feel like you have enough going on. When my kids were little I said to myself, "When my kids are older I will be more helpful." And here I am. We all do what we can to suport our children.

Your membership in PTA gives us numbers to advocate for children in our state and national government and be a force for their good. The programs we sponsor enhance their school experience, at least that is our goal.

At Back To School Night a parent asked a really good question, "How much could I donate so we don't have all these fundraisers?" To clarify, the PTA only sponsors one fundraiser, the Walk-A-Thon in the spring. The membership we collect \$8 does not cover all the program costs. For each \$8 we pay \$2.25 to the National PTA, \$1.75 to the State PTA and \$.50 to our council, a total of \$4.50. So we keep \$3.50. We average 200 PTA members at our school. That would give us \$700 for our programs at the school. We could ask for straight donations, the first year I had a child at the school they asked for \$10 per student and promised no fundraisers if we did that. I only had one student so I loved that idea! The PTA didn't get enough so they had to do a fundraiser. We have just under 1,000 students and if we received a donation of \$10 per student we could run all the programs. We have been blessed to have generous sponsors who donate to our PTA (see the PTA page on the school website for specific sponsors). We also have amazing parents! I am so grateful for all of you and all the different ways you make a difference in our school community.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early** School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**


- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.


#### When Do Absences Become a Problem?
