id you know that students typically make the most academic growth during the months of January and February? That is why it is important for teachers to "jump right in" when students arrive back from winter break. Doing so allows them to maximize this window of optimal learning. There are several things you can do at home to help make sure your child is ready to pick up where they left off before the break. Reading, writing, and providing learning experiences during the break are great ways to be a collaborator in your child's educational experience.

Below is a compilation of activities you could do with your children over the holidays. These activities will keep your kids on track without them even knowing

Winter Break Reading Fun

Recipes: Have your child read a recipe to you. You can even have them prepare something for you from a recipe.

Read the Book: Many holiday movies are based on a book. Have your child read the book prior to watching the movie. If it is a difficult book for them, read it to them.

12 Nights of Holiday Favorites: Select 12 stories to read with your child during the second half of the month. Choose from family favorites, classic stories, or the newest books out there.

Books as Gifts: Giving a book as a gift is a great way to get kids excited about reading (it may not be the first thing they play with but eventually they will have time to read it). Also, if your child gives a book as a gift, have them read it first so they can talk about it with the receiver.

Winter Break Writing Fun

Journal: Have students write journal entries for each day of vacation.

Letters/Cards: A hand written letter or card is a great way for children to practice their writing skills at home. Plus, the receiver will want to keep it forever!

Menu: Creating a holiday menu with descriptions of what is being prepared allows your child to be a part of meal preparation as well as practicing their writing skills.

Family Traditions: Encourage your child to become the family historian by documenting your traditions. They can create a book with all the treasured things you do.

Holiday Story: Help your child write their own original holiday story. Drawing and labeling is also a great way to let students share their story ideas. Children who are not writers can draw pictures and label them through sounding out.

Learning Experiences

Museum: Take some time during the break to visit a museum your child would be interested in.

Explore the outdoors: Explore the great outdoors taking time to discuss the various aspects of nature and science.



Advanced Learning Lab (A. L. L.) Testing Saturdays – January 7th to January 28th 2017

The Alpine School District Gifted Services department will be conducting 8 sessions of testing for placements in the district A. L. L. classrooms for the 2017-2018 school year. Any interested 2nd grader through 7th grader in ASD is invited to attend a testing session to qualify for a placement in an Advanced Learning Lab (A. L. L.). The testing will occur according to the schedule below. All 2nd-7th graders interested in a placement for the next year will **have to test** for original placement in the A.L.L. program. If students are currently in an elementary or secondary A.L.L. program they do not need to retest if they have completed the intent to continue form. However, all 6th grade students must retest for placement between the elementary and secondary level. Testing for secondary A.L.L. is for designated English, History and Science classes. Math testing and placement is completed at individual schools.

Testing for both Elementary and Secondary Advanced Learning Lab (A. L. L.) programs will be done on Saturdays, January 7th to January 28th. The online registration is now open and will close the Tuesday prior to each testing session. There will be a \$20.00 fee for the testing. Students on free or reduced lunch status will register on-line with a reduced cost. Registering within three days of testing is considered a late registration and will incur an additional \$5.00 fee. Late registrants will be admitted upon availability. There are no refunds.

CEDAR RIDGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL'S INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

It's beginning to look a lot like Winter...

With the recent change in weather, we thought it would be a good time to send home our policy about inclement weather days.

Ideally, students would be outside as much as possible before the morning bell rings and during recess. This allows the children to play under supervision and the teachers to get ready for the day.

Children are expected to dress appropriately for the weather. In cold weather, we would expect children to come to school in coats, hats, and gloves. When there is a slight drizzle, children would be expected to wear waterproof jackets or to use an umbrella.

We have the children come into the school only when the weather makes it necessary. We follow these guidelines to call an inside day:

- *The temperature is below 21° F (including windchill)
- *The precipitation is such that a child would remain wet for long periods of time
- *The wind is excessively strong
- *The air quality is excessively bad

Children who decide for themselves that they would prefer to stay inside are invited to sit inside a doorway and quietly talk to a friend or read a book.
