Principal's Message

oes my child really need to read at home every night? This might be a question that you've asked yourself once or twice this year. You may also wonder why reading at home is so important when children do so much reading practice at school. I wanted to share some fascinating research that has been done about reading time at home.

I have heard many teachers at this school tell their students, "You don't need to read every day, just on the days you eat." I wish every parent and child believed that reading is this important. The fact is, reading with a high level of fluency and comprehension is an essential skill that children will need to graduate from high school, and a high school diploma is necessary to provide a living in today's competitive job market. If a child does not learn to read, he or she will have vastly reduced opportunities in the future.

The following infographic shows the huge difference in the number of words between a child who reads 20 minutes a day and a child who reads 1 minute a day:

Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?

Student "B"


Student "A" reads 20 minutes each day

reads 5 minutes each day 3600 minutes in 900 minutes in a school year

Student "C" reads 1 minut each day

a school year

180 minutes in a school year



By the end of 6th grade Student "A" will have read the equivalent of 60 whole school days. Student "B" will have read only 12 school days. Which student would you expect to have a better vocabulary? Which student would you expect to be more successful in school...and in life? (Nagy & Hormon,

It is my hope that you will take the time to read at least 20 minutes with your child every day. This is a great way to prepare your child for jr. high, high school, and beyond!
