

White Medal - Students must complete one task from three different areas. Blue Medal - Students must complete two tasks from three different areas. Orange Medal - Students must complete three tasks from three different areas.

Citizenship tasks are completed by turning in the report of what you did.

Physical Fitness tasks are completed by parent/guardian signature on the back of the reading chart. Laps may be ran or walked.
