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

# 2014 - 2015 School Improvement Plan

Deerfield Elementary received \$53,467 in Trust Lands funds for the 2014-2015 school year. Our School Community Council, composed of parents, teachers, and administration, using school achievement data, determined Trust Lands funds would be used to improve student achievement in reading and math. Deerfield students benefitted greatly from the these resources and programs. Our students made great progress in both language arts and mathematics this past year. Trust Lands funds were used to support the following:

Chrome Books: Laptop computers purchased for grade 3 and 4. Students used the computers to access online literacy and math resources.

Double Dose: An intervention held during track time with a focus on literacy and comprehension.

Math Aides: Grade levels had access to an aide four days a week for math support.


STAR Reading: An intensive one-on-one literacy intervention for students grades 1 - 3.

Kindergarten Aide: Tutored students one-on-one to build math and literacy skills.

Take Home Reading: This program supplied students with level appropriate books to be read at home.

Summer Planning: Teams of teachers were given additional time to plan lessons and assessments.

Literacy Coordinators: Two teachers trained our Double Dose aides, gathered data and designed the daily lesson plans for Double Dose.
